

With the final data collection of the 2007 drop progeny now completed, we thank Michael & Jane Craig and their family for hosting the 2006 and 2007 drop trials at their Tuloona property. Under Michael's management we have been able to run very successful trials under very challenging seasonal conditions.



We have scanned ewes joined for this year's 2009 trial and are well under way with this second trial being run at Mokanger.

We are still looking for a new host property to run the next 2 trials.

Australian Merino Sire Evaluation Association (AMSEA) are under going a future commercialization review. Already link sires will have to be funded by sites next year. We hope that by operating our current trials with one evaluation at 18 months of age instead of 2 evaluations over 2 years will help us to keep our budgets in balance.

The industry combined vote in the near future for wool tax levels for AWI will directly effect AWI's ability to provide industry support for co-ordinating trials across Australia and indirectly effect our future trial funding.

A special thank you to Sue Jarvis who steps down as our Data Manager with the finish of trials at Tuloona. Sue and Hugh remain very valuable members of our Committee. Marion Gibbins returns after some years, as Data Manager at Mokanger. Once again a special thanks to all helpers at recent working bees.

Things are looking good here at Tuloona. Despite relatively low rainfall of only 102mm for the first 6 months up until the 1st July, the timing of those rainfall events have nearly been perfect. Crops are looking good and even our pasture systems are growing and most stock were weaned off their feeding rations by the middle of June.

The 07 drop Sire Evaluation Sheep were classed on the 15th June and then shorn and body weighed on the 22nd June. The animals looked relatively strong off shears and were averaging around 2.7 condition score. The 07 drop evaluation program is now complete and it has been a very rewarding and enjoyable process to be involved in the two trials. As genetics are a key profit driver in all types of wool enterprises, the Elders Sire Evaluation Program provides critical knowledge and insight into our industry's genetic progression.

Mokanger has had a great start to the season receiving 200mm of timely rain so far. All ewes are condition score 2.5-3, with trial ewes on the higher end.
